Pepper, Black Hungarian	Capsicum annuum	Unique, black-colored fruit shaped like Jalapeno. They are mildly hot and have a delicious flavor. Tall plants have beautiful purple flowers that make this variety very ornamental. Rare and colorful!
Pepper, California Wonder	Capsicum annuum	Deep green to red, thick-walled with an attractive glossy flesh. Fruits are medium-sized, 4" by 4", 3 to 4-lobed, smooth and blocky. A nice stuffer, with high yields
Pepper, Chinese 5 Color	Capsicum annuum	Screaming-hot little peppers turn a rainbow of vibrant colors, from purple, cream, yellow, orange to red as they ripen. Ornamental, great for containers.
Pepper, King of the North	Capsicum annuum	An exciting bell pepper for short-season growers. This variety produces nice, blocky fruit that are nicely flavored when picked green or red.

2. Click on the name of the plant you wish to purchase.
3. Enter quantity. (Note, some quantities are limited. You may not be allowed to enter the quantity you desire.)
4. Click ADD TO CART. (Items in your Cart are NOT "bought" until you complete payment and click PAY NOW.)

#### CHECKOUT:

1. Click VIEW CART in the SHOPPING CART (right side of your screen).
2. Check your order and make adjustments as necessary.  
NOTE: Items in your cart will not be purchased until payment is processed.
3. Click on box under Pick up Date to select Pick up Date (May 29) & Time.

### **Do you need helpers at the Sale?**

Thank you for asking. Due to UW Madison-Extension guidelines, only Ozaukee Master Gardeners can volunteer at the sale this year.

### **Will the sale continue to be online forever?**

Given the strong demand for the Ozaukee Master Gardener sale (having been canceled in 2020 due to COVID) the 2021 sale is our next best option to in-person. We will continue to look to UW Madison-Extension to provide guidance prior to making any future decision about holding a sale.

### **When can I begin shopping?**

The Master Gardener Plant Sale online store will open at 10 AM on Monday, May 10. Place your order before Friday, May 15 at 5:15 PM.

### **I can't enter the quantity of plants I want?**

There may be a limited quantity of plants available for certain varieties. NOTE: Items in your Cart are not “PURCHASED” until you complete payment and click PAY NOW. We encourage you to review the Plant List prior to ordering to expedite your online shopping experience.

### **Can I change my order after I placed it?**

Sorry, all sales are final once you click the PAY NOW button.

### **Can I call in or email an order and send a check?**

No, all plants must be ordered and paid for online with a credit card.

### **Can I place multiple orders (shop more than once) in the online store?**

We suggest you make a list of the plants you want prior to shopping in our online store. Given anticipated demand for plants, it would be best to buy all of your plants at once so you are not disappointed if a plant sells out.

### **After I checked out and paid, can I come back and put more in my cart?**

No. You will need to start a new cart (purchase). AND, if the original time slot you selected when placing your first order is filled, you will need to select an additional time slot and pick up your new order at that new time. We cannot combine separate orders from different time slots into one order.
